MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CROWFOOT VALLEY RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 2 HELD NOVEMBER 4, 2016

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Crowfoot Valley Ranch Metropolitan District No. 2 (referred to hereafter as "Board") was convened on Friday, the 4th day of November, 2016, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of Consolidated Investment Group, 18 Inverness Place, Englewood, Colorado 80112. The meeting was open to the public.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the absence of Tim Bertoch was excused.

DISCLOSURE OF POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Disclosures of Potential Conflicts of Interest: The Board discussed the requirements pursuant to the Colorado Revised Statutes to disclose any potential conflicts of interest or potential breaches of fiduciary duty to the Board of Directors and to the Secretary of State.

Ms. Finn noted that a quorum was present and requested members of the Board to disclose any potential conflicts of interest with regard to any matters scheduled for discussion at this meeting. It was noted that Directors Bertoch and Medina are employees of the developer of the project and it was also noted that Directors Waggoner and Clore have a contractual relationship with the developer to develop the project.

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ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

Agenda: Ms. Finn distributed for the Board's review and approval a proposed Agenda for the District's regular meeting.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Agenda was approved..

Approval of Meeting Location: The Board entered into a discussion regarding the requirements of Section 32-1-903(1), C.R.S., concerning the location of the District's Board meeting.

Following discussion, and upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board determined that because there was not a suitable or convenient location within its boundaries, or within 20 miles of its boundaries, to conduct this meeting, it was determined to conduct the meeting at the above-stated location. The Board further noted that notice of this location was duly posted and that they have not received any objections to the location or any requests that the meeting place be changed by taxpaying electors within its boundaries.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Waggoner seconded by Director Clore and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Minutes of the November 6, 2015 regular meeting and the June 13, 2016 special meeting were approved.

Resolution Concerning 2017 Annual Administration Matter: The Board entered into discussion regarding the Resolution Concerning 2017 Annual Administrative Matters.

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Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Waggoner and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board adopted the Resolution Concerning 2017 Annual Administrative Matters. A copy of the adopted Resolution is attached to these Minutes and incorporated herein by this reference.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Unaudited Financials and Cash Position Schedule: The Board deferred discussion.

2015 Application for Exemption from Audit: Mr. Carroll reviewed with the Board the 2015 Application for Exemption from Audit.

Following review and discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Waggoner, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board ratified approval of execution and filing of the Application for Exemption from Audit for 2015.

Preparation of 2016 Application for Exemption from Audit: The Board discussed the requirements for an audit.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Waggoner, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board appointed the District Accountant to prepare and file the 2016 Application for Exemption from Audit with the State Auditor by the statutory deadline.

Cash Access Addendum to Professional Services Agreement with CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP: Mr. Carroll reviewed with the Board a Cash Access Addendum to the Professional Services Agreement with CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP.

Following review and discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Medina and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the Cash Access Addendum to the Professional Services Agreement with CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP.

2016 Budget Amendment Hearing: The President opened the public hearing to consider the Resolution to Amend the 2016 Budget and discuss related issues.

It was noted that publication of Notice stating that the Board would consider adoption of a Resolution to Amend the 2016 Budget and the date, time, and place of the public hearing was made in a newspaper having general circulation within the District. No written objections were received prior to this public hearing.

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There were no comments from the public in attendance and the public hearing was closed.

Following review, it was determined that an amendment was not needed and no action was taken by the Board.

2017 Budget: The President opened the public hearing to consider the proposed 2017 Budget and discuss related issues.

It was noted that publication of Notice stating that the Board would consider adoption of the Budget and the date, time and place of the public hearing was made in a newspaper having general circulation within the District. No written objections were received prior to this public hearing.

No public comments were received and the public hearing was closed.

Mr. Carroll reviewed the estimated 2016 expenditures and proposed 2017 expenditures.

Following discussion, the Board considered the adoption of Resolution No. 2016-11-02 to Adopt the 2017 Budget and Appropriate Sums of Money and Set Mill Levies (for the General Fund at 70.000 mills, the Debt Service Fund at 0.000 mills and Other Funds at 6.750 mills, for a total mill levy of 76.750 mills). Upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Waggoner and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Resolutions were adopted, as discussed, and execution of the Certification of Budget and Certification of Mill Levies was authorized, subject to receipt of final Certification of Assessed Valuation from the County on or before December 10, 2016. Ms. Finn was authorized to transmit the Certification of Mill Levies to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County and the Division of Local Government, not later than December 15, 2016. Ms. Finn was also authorized to transmit the Certification of Budget to the Division of Local Government not later than January 30, 2017. Copies of the adopted Resolutions are attached to these minutes and incorporated herein by this reference.

DLG-70 Mill Levy Certification: Mr. Carroll discussed with the Board the DLG-70 Mill Levy Certification form.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Waggoner and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board authorized the District Accountant to prepare and sign the DLG-70 mill levy certification form,

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for certification to the Board of County Commissioners and other interested parties.

2018 Budget: The Board discussed preparation of the 2018 Budget.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Clore, seconded by Director Waggoner and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board appointed the District Accountant to prepare the 2018 Budget and to set the public hearing to consider adoption of the 2018 Budget on Friday, November 3, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. at the regular meeting location.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, upon motion duly made, seconded and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

**RESOLUTION
TO ADOPT 2017 BUDGET, APPROPRIATE SUMS OF MONEY,
AND AUTHORIZE THE CERTIFICATION OF THE TAX LEVY
CROWFOOT VALLEY RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 2**

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR EACH FUND, ADOPTING A BUDGET, LEVYING GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2017 TO HELP DEFRAY THE COSTS OF GOVERNMENT, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE VARIOUS FUNDS IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE CROWFOOT VALLEY RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 2, DOUGLAS COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, 2017, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER, 2017,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Crowfoot Valley Ranch Metropolitan District No. 2 has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published or posted in accordance with the law, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on November 4, 2016, and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues or planned to be expended from reserves or fund balances so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating purposes from property tax revenue is \$41,364; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors finds that it is required to temporarily lower the operating mill levy to render a refund for \$-0-; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for voter-approved bonds and interest is \$-0-; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for contractual obligation purposes from property tax revenue as approved by voters from property tax revenue is \$3,989; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for capital expenditure purposes from property tax revenue as approved by voters or at public hearing is \$-0-; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for refunds/abatements is \$-0-; and

WHEREAS, the 2016 valuation for assessment for the District as certified by the County Assessor of Douglas County is \$590,920; and

WHEREAS, at an election held on November 5, 2002, the District has eliminated the revenue and expenditure limitations imposed on governmental entities by Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and Section 29-1-301, C.R.S., as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CROWFOOT VALLEY RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 2 OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1. Adoption of Budget. That the budget as submitted, and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted as the budget of the Crowfoot Valley Ranch Metropolitan District No. 2 for calendar year 2017.

Section 2. Budget Revenues. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 3. Budget Expenditures. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 4. Levy of General Property Taxes. That the Board of Directors does hereby certify the levy of general property taxes for collection in 2017 as follows:

A. Levy for General Operating and Other Expenses. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2017 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 70.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2016.

B. Temporary Tax Credit or Rate Reduction. That pursuant to Section 39-1-111.5, C.R.S. for the purposes of effect of a refund for the purposes set forth in Section 20 of Article X of the Colorado Constitution, there is hereby certified a temporary property tax credit or temporary mill levy rate reduction of 0.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the boundaries of the District for the year 2016.

C. Levy for General Obligation Bonds and Interest. That for the purposes of meeting all debt retirement expense of the District during the 2017 budget

year, as the funding requirements of the current outstanding general obligation indebtedness is detailed in the following "Certification of Tax Levies," there is hereby levied a tax of 0.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2016.

D. Levy for Contractual Obligations. That for the purposes of meeting the contractual obligation expense of the District during the 2017 budget year, as detailed in the following "Certification of Tax Levies," there is hereby levied a tax of 6.750 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2016.

E. Levy for Capital Expenditures. That for the purposes of meeting all capital expenditures of the District during the 2017 budget year pursuant to Section 29-1-301(1.2) or 29-1-302(1.5), C.R.S., there is hereby levied a tax of 0.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the boundaries of the District for the year 2016.

F. Levy for Refunds/Abatements. That for the purposes of recoupment of refunds/abatements of taxes pursuant to Section 39-10-114(1)(a)(I)(B), C.R.S., there is hereby levied a tax of 0.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the boundaries of the District for the year 2016.

Section 5. Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.

Section 6. Certification. That the Secretary of the District is hereby authorized and directed to certify by December 15, 2016, to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Colorado, the mill levies for the District herein above determined and set, or be authorized and directed to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Colorado, as herein above determined and set, but as recalculated as needed upon receipt of the final certification of valuation from the County Assessor on or about December 10, 2016, in order to comply with any applicable revenue and other budgetary limits or to implement the intent of the District. That said certification shall be in substantially the form set out and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. Appropriations. That the amounts set forth as expenditures and balances remaining, as specifically allocated in the budget attached hereto, are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for the purposes stated and no other.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ASSUMPTIONS

Services Provided

The District, a quasi-municipal corporation and a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, was organized by order and decree of the District Court for Douglas County on December 3, 2002, and is governed pursuant to provisions of the Colorado Special District Act (Title 32, Article 1, Colorado Revised Statutes). The District's service area is located in Douglas County, Colorado.

The District was organized to provide financing for the design, acquisition, installation and construction of sanitation improvements, water improvements, street improvements, traffic and safety control improvements, park and recreation improvements, transportation improvements, television relay and translation improvements, mosquito control, fire protection, emergency medical services, and operation and maintenance of the District. Under the Service Plan, the District is the Financing District related to Crowfoot Valley Ranch Metropolitan District No. 1, the Service District ("District No. 1").

On November 4, 2014, the District's voters authorized general obligation indebtedness of \$53,000,000 for street improvements, \$53,000,000 for parks and recreation, \$53,000,000 for water supply system, \$53,000,000 for sanitary sewer system, \$53,000,000 for traffic and safety control, \$53,000,000 for public transport, \$53,000,000 for fire protection and emergency response facilities, and \$106,000,000 for refinancing of District debt. This voter authorization replaced the voter authorization of November 5, 2002. District voters also approved authorization for the District to retain and spend District revenues, from any lawful source, in excess of the spending, revenue raising or other limitations in Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado constitution.

The District has no employees and all administrative functions are contracted.

The District prepares its budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the requirements of Colorado Revised Statutes C.R.S. 29-1-105.

Revenues

Property Taxes

Property taxes are levied by the District's Board of Directors. The levy is based on assessed valuations determined by the County Assessor generally as of January 1 of each year. The levy is normally set by December 15 by certification to the County Commissioners to put the tax lien on the individual properties as of January 1 of the following year. The County Treasurer collects the determined taxes during the ensuing calendar year. The taxes are payable by April or, if in equal installments, at the taxpayer's election, in February and June. Delinquent taxpayers are notified in August and generally sales of the tax liens on delinquent properties are held in November or December. The County Treasurer remits the taxes collected monthly to the District.

The District's service plan sets a mill levy cap for payment of general obligation debt and for operations and maintenance of 70.000 mills district wide, with 20.00 mills for operating costs. Additionally 6.75 mills is designated for fire protection, payable to the Castle Rock Fire Protection District. The operating mill levy may include an additional levy not to exceed 10.00 mills for subdistricts created to serve specific areas within the district.

The calculation of the taxes levied is displayed on page 3 of the budget at the adopted total mill levy of 76.750 mills, which includes 70.000 mills for operations and 6.750 mills for fire protection and emergency response.

Revenues - (continued)

Specific Ownership Taxes

Specific ownership taxes are set by the State and collected by the County Treasurer, primarily on vehicle licensing within the County as a whole. The specific ownership taxes are allocated by the County Treasurer to all taxing entities within the County. The budget assumes that the District's share will be equal to approximately 9.0% of the total property taxes collected by the General Fund.

Net Investment Income

Interest earned on the District's available funds has been estimated based on an average interest rate of approximately 0.50%.

Expenditures

General and Administrative Expenditures

District No. 1 is the operating District; therefore, general and administrative expenditures necessary to maintain the District's administrative viability such as legal, accounting, managerial, insurance, meeting expense, and other administrative expenses will be incurred in District No. 1 for both Districts.

Transfer to District No. 1

The District will transfer its operating property tax and specific ownership tax revenues, net of any applicable fees, to District No. 1 to fund operating costs.

Payment to Town

The District has entered into an intergovernmental agreement with the Town of Castle Rock for fire protection and emergency response services. The Town of Castle Rock was required to build a new fire station to service the District and as a result the District agreed to levy 6.750 mills and remit the proceeds, net of collection fees, to the Town annually.

County Treasurer's Fees

County Treasurer's fees have been computed at 1.5% of property tax collections.

Debt and Leases

The District has no outstanding indebtedness, nor any operating or capital leases.
